READING KEYS

GIFTS OF PROCLAMATION

P1 · Apostle (Ephesians 4:11) — Being recognized as a spiritual authority by several churches: founding, strengthening and connecting communities, like one who is sent.

In the Bible: “Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.” (Acts 13:2)

Your field: new plantings, churches to strengthen, pioneers.

P2 · Prophecy (Romans 12:6) — Receiving and delivering with strength a message from God that builds up, exhorts, comforts and calls people back to Him.

In the Bible: “Let us prophesy in proportion to our faith.” (Romans 12:6)

Your field: those who have drifted, the lukewarm, situations of injustice.

↔ This gift spans two families: it proclaims the Word (proclamation) and leads the people (leadership).

P3 · Missionary (1 Corinthians 9:19-23) — Adapting with ease to other cultures to serve and proclaim Christ there.

In the Bible: “I have become all things to all men, that I might by all means save some.” (1 Corinthians 9:22)

Your field: other cultures, unreached lands, church planting.

P4 · Evangelism (Ephesians 4:11) — Presenting the Gospel in such a way that people come to faith in Jesus.

In the Bible: Philip “preached Jesus to him.” (Acts 8:35)

Your field: strangers, colleagues, neighbors far from faith.

P5 · Teaching (Romans 12:7) — Making biblical truth simple and clear, within everyone's reach.

In the Bible: “Making the difficult clear is the mark of a good teacher.” (cf. James 3:1)

Your field: new believers, study groups, those who have questions.

P6 · Knowledge (1 Corinthians 12:8) — Discovering, gathering, analyzing and formulating the truths of the Word for the growth of believers.

In the Bible: “Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly.” (Colossians 3:16)

Your field: research, writing, training, Bible study.

P7 · Wisdom (1 Corinthians 12:8) — Applying God's truth to concrete situations to unblock, redirect, or defuse a conflict.

In the Bible: “Give to Your servant an understanding heart... to discern.” (1 Kings 3:9)

Your field: those facing decisions, complex situations, mentoring.

P8 · Tongues (Acts 2:1-11) — Speaking a real foreign language in order to proclaim the Gospel in the language of the listener.

In the Bible: “We hear them speaking in our own tongues the wonderful works of God.” (Acts 2:11)

Your field: missionaries, translators, hosts of foreigners.

P9 · Interpretation of tongues (1 Corinthians 14:26-28) — Faithfully conveying a message in the listener's language: the ministry of translation.

In the Bible: “Let one who speaks in a tongue pray that he may interpret.” (1 Corinthians 14:13)

Your field: translation, preaching, publishing, media.

P10 · Music (1 Samuel 16:14-23) — Singing or playing an instrument to praise God, build up the Church and witness.

In the Bible: “David would take a harp... and Saul would become refreshed and well.” (1 Samuel 16:23)

Your field: worship, concerts, evangelistic programs.

P11 · Artistic creativity (Exodus 31:1-11) — Using art in all its forms to build up the Church and witness to unbelievers.

In the Bible: “I have filled him with the Spirit of God... to design artistic works.” (Exodus 31:3)

Your field: art, the stage, writing, creative evangelism.

GIFTS OF LEADERSHIP

D1 · Shepherd (pastor) (John 10:1-15) — Providing spiritual care for a group of believers: guiding, feeding and protecting the sheep.

In the Bible: “The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep.” (John 10:11)

Your field: small groups, care of members, newcomers.

D2 · Leadership (1 Timothy 3:1-5) — Setting goals in line with the Word and drawing each one to cooperate freely, in humility.

In the Bible: “He who leads, with diligence.” (Romans 12:8)

Your field: teams, projects, coordinating the mission.

D3 · Administration (Exodus 18:13-27) — Understanding a goal, then planning, coordinating and managing effective programs to reach it.

In the Bible: Jethro to Moses: “Select able men... and place them over them.” (Exodus 18:21)

Your field: administration, projects, the Church's logistics.

D4 · Faith (Romans 4:18-21) — Recognizing and carrying out God's will with an exceptional confidence that dares the impossible.

In the Bible: “Contrary to hope, in hope he believed.” (Romans 4:18)

Your field: new ventures, persevering prayer, those who have lost hope.

GIFTS OF SERVICE

S1 · Helps (Luke 10:38-42) — Putting your talents at the service of other believers to make them more effective; relieving leaders.

In the Bible: “Martha was distracted with much serving.” (Luke 10:40)

Your field: support to leaders, secretarial work, logistics.

S2 · Service (Luke 22:24-27) — Carrying out the Church's practical and priority tasks, in every material area.

In the Bible: “I am among you as the One who serves.” (Luke 22:27)

Your field: practical tasks, welcome, material logistics.

S3 · Mercy (Luke 10:33-37) — Feeling real compassion for those who suffer and helping them concretely, especially the excluded.

In the Bible: The Samaritan “had compassion.” (Luke 10:33)

Your field: the sick, the grieving, the excluded, prisoners.

S4 · Encouragement (Acts 4:36) — Encouraging, supporting, comforting and consoling the discouraged, with the right words and gestures.

In the Bible: Barnabas, “Son of Encouragement,” welcomed the unwanted. (Acts 4:36)

Your field: the discouraged, new believers, one-to-one care.

S5 · Hospitality (Genesis 18:1-8) — Opening your home to welcome warmly those who need shelter or a meal.

In the Bible: “Be hospitable to one another without grumbling.” (1 Peter 4:9)

Your field: the isolated, the stranger, the missional table.

S6 · Giving (2 Corinthians 8:2-5) — Giving your material goods generously and joyfully for the cause of God.

In the Bible: “They gave beyond their ability.” (2 Corinthians 8:3)

Your field: the poor, families in hardship, projects short of means.

S7 · Craftsmanship (Exodus 31:1-11) — Serving the Church through practical, ingenious work of your hands.

In the Bible: Dorcas “made tunics and garments” for the widows. (Acts 9:39)

Your field: maintenance, building, decorating, cooking.

GIFTS OF POWER & SPECIAL GIFTS

G1 · Healings (James 5:14-15) — Being an intermediary through whom God heals and restores the sick — body, soul, relationships.

In the Bible: “The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise him up.” (James 5:15)

Your field: the sick, one-to-one care, prayer groups.

G2 · Miracles (cf. Acts 19:11) — Performing, by God's will alone, acts that go beyond natural laws and are recognized as divine.

In the Bible: “God worked unusual miracles by the hands of Paul.” (Acts 19:11)

Your field: situations with no human way out, pioneer mission.

G3 · Discernment of spirits (Hebrews 5:14) — Discerning whether a behavior or teaching comes from God, from man, or from the evil one.

In the Bible: “By reason of use they have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.” (Hebrews 5:14)

Your field: leadership, mentoring, protecting the Church.

G4 · Prayer / intercession (Luke 11:1-13) — Praying with remarkable perseverance and carrying the needs of others before God.

In the Bible: “Pray without ceasing.” (1 Thessalonians 5:17)

Your field: everyone — often without anyone knowing.

G5 · Voluntary poverty (Acts 4:32-37) — Willingly renouncing wealth and material security to live and serve among the poorest.

In the Bible: “All things were common... nor was there anyone among them who lacked.” (Acts 4:32-34)

Your field: the marginalized, community life, mission among the poor.

G6 · Celibacy (1 Corinthians 7:32-35) — Living happily without a spouse, free and available for the service of God.

In the Bible: “He who is unmarried cares for the things of the Lord.” (1 Corinthians 7:32)

Your field: mobile ministries, church planting, overseas mission.

G7 · Willingness to suffer for the faith (cf. 1 Peter 4:12-14) — Accepting suffering, and even death, for the name of Jesus, keeping a confident and victorious attitude.

In the Bible: “If you are reproached for the name of Christ, blessed are you.” (1 Peter 4:14)

Your field: times of trial, places hostile to the faith.

“Lord, what You have given me, I give back to You to serve. Show me the first person to go to this week. Here am I — Hinéni.”

The result is not a label, it is a call. To be confirmed in prayer and with the body.
