One sheet per person · anonymous · keep for yourself

“Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening.” — 1 Samuel 3:9

Start here. In « Back to the Altar », the personal altar comes before the home altar: everything begins with you, alone before God. This sheet is complete in itself. Your home altar comes next (Sheet B).

DIAGNOSIS — THE BROKEN ALTAR (FOR ME, ALONE BEFORE GOD)

MY COMMITMENT – FROM SCHEDULE TO AVAILABILITY

The trap: “I schedule an appointment with God” – I still hold the calendar. The true altar: “I **authorize** God to summon me at any hour, even in the dead of night.” It is Samuel's answer, woken in the night.

The fixed hour I set (the appointment I keep): – *e.g. 5:30 a.m. daily, 15 min in the Word, no phone*

“I authorize God to set the hour of the meeting Himself, so that I may meet Him.”

Our home altar

One sheet per household · keep and bring back to each session

“So he repaired the altar of the LORD that was broken down.” — 1 Kings 18:30

Your personal altar (Sheet A) now **overflows** onto your **household**: your family under your roof if you have one, or your **oikos** — neighbors, younger believers, the household of faith — if you live alone.

Note — for those who live alone: If you live alone: your altar is already set — it is **Sheet A, your personal altar**, the foundation. Here, your « household » is your **oikos**: those God places on your path (neighbors, younger believers, the household of faith). Fill this sheet for them. The « together » lines are then lived before God, or with your oikos.

My missional network · one sheet per family

My sheet — The 3 conversations

One sheet per person

Where is your person? Each stage has its conversation.

Stage 1 “I’m not looking” — the person lives their life, not yet searching.

FAR → **Conversation ① — about LIFE**

Stage 2 “I’m asking questions” — about faith, death, meaning. They open up.

CURIOUS → **Conversation ② — about MEANING**

Stage 3 “I’m actively seeking” — they read, ask, come to church.

CONVINCED → **Conversation ③ — about DECISION**

Stage 4 “I want to follow Jesus” — they ask for baptism.

DECISION → **Walk them toward the baptism class**

Critical rule: never skip a stage. Too soon, the person closes up; too late, they stall.
